

### MEET THE CAST

**Rich McCoy** (Willie Clark/Director) has acted with Harvey Mack off and on for the past 25 years, playing Oscar to his Felix, Hucklebee to his Bellomy, and now Willie to his Al. Harvey directed Rich as Applegate in *Damn Yankees* and Rich directed Harvey as Victor Velasco in *Barefoot in the Park*. "This is why I do theatre. Friends like Harvey, Jim Hepworth, Darin Harms, Johnny Molson, and Gus Gordon make these experiences a cherished part of my life."

Harvey Mack (Al Lewis) has appeared at the Hoogland Center for the Arts (HCFTA) in our productions of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Gypsy, Time Stands Still,* and *The Fantasticks.* He also performed in the HCFTA/Over the Moon Production of *Enchanted April,* and several shows at Theatre in the Park (TIP) and Jacksonville Theatre Guild (JTG). Harvey enjoys playing bass with the UIS Orchestra.

**Johnny Molson** (Ben Silverman) has appeared in many roles at HCFTA, including his comic performances as Hysterium in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* and Felix Unger in *The Odd Couple*. Jim Hepworth (Patient) is an area theater veteran of 30 plus years. He has appeared in our productions of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, All The Way* and *Big River*.
